Strategic Action Plan on HumanRights and Technologies in Biomedicine (2020 – 2025)

- Convention on Human Rights and Biomedicine: general framework for the protection of fundamental rights and freedoms with regards to the applications of biology and medicine.
- 20th anniversary conference (Strasbourg Oct 2017): to reflect upon the relevance of the principles laid down in the Convention and the possible challenges posed to those principles in light of the scientific and technological developments
- **Principles** enshrined in the Oviedo Convention **remain of crucial relevance**, however important new human rights challenges have emerged that need to be addressed.

To combat health disparities created by social and demographic changes in Council of Europe member States. Initial focus: Innovative treatment and interventions

- Article 28 of the Oviedo Convention recognises the importance of trustworthy governance and the need for public engagement and democratic accountability
- Need to promote societal dialogue between the public, scientists and policy public health crisis.
